Comments: Based on 10km separation distance, and data in PODS, there are probably about 100 EOs. This species has not been tracked.

Area of Occupancy: G = 501-2,500 4-km² grid cells

Comments: 732 4km sq grid cells

Environmental

Specificity: BC = Narrow to moderate

Comments: Generally requires older forest for nesting, though edge may be important for foraging.

Short Term Trends: G = Relatively Stable (<=10% change)

Comments: Very little population information available. PIF regional population trend scores are 2 (N Rockies) and 3, indicating stable to small declines, or unknown.

Long Term Trends: U = Unknown

Comments: None

Threat Impact: C = Medium

Comments: Sensitive to logging, habitat fragmentation to an uncertain degree. NS calculated rank agrees with PIF Threats to Breeding (regional) of 3.

Intrinsic Vulnerability: Not Evaluated

Comments: None

Heritage Rank: S4

Comments: Large range statewide; little indication of population declines. Logging, habitat fragmentation are potential threats.
