Comments: 137 specimens examined in Barrasa and Rico (2003) article and this was limited to the Iberian Peninsula. Estimated worldwide the number of grid cells to be >126, probably >500. Barrasa and Rico article use the words "frequently", "common", and "widespread" in describing reports about this species
