Comments: Approx 15 4 km sq grid cells, but there are likely additional records.

Comments: Probably fewer than 25 EOs, see Marshall et al. 2003.

Good Viability: C = Few (4-12) occurrences with excellent or good viability or ecological integrity

Comments: Requires large continuous stands of mature juniper habitat for breeding.
