Comments: Al St. John: found in mountainous pine-oak-chapparral largely removed from humans. Light logging not likely to impact greatly. Jason Reilly (Medford BLM): believes zonata more common than getula in SW Oregon. Both agree that S3S4 is accurate.

Rank Notes: Calculator Rank (unrevised)=S3. Based on communication from Al St. John, Bruce Bury and Jason Reilly, this species is probably more common than our records indicate.
